These 10 botanical gardens were selected by our expert panelists and contributors and voted on by readers as the best of the best.

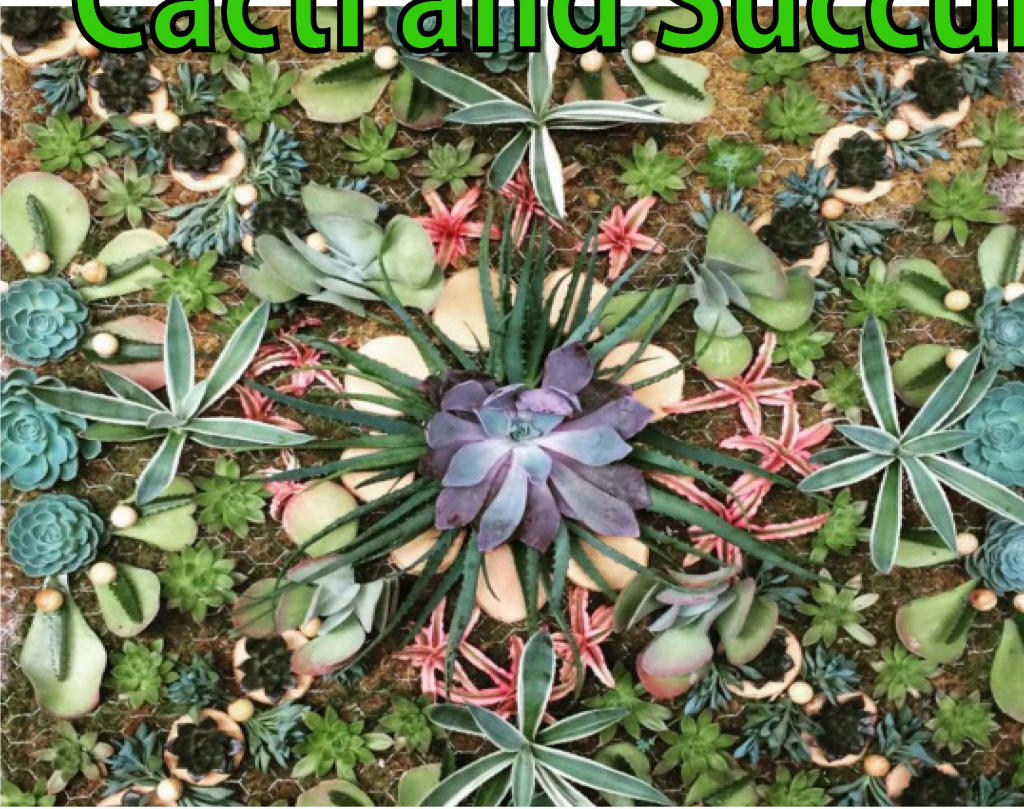


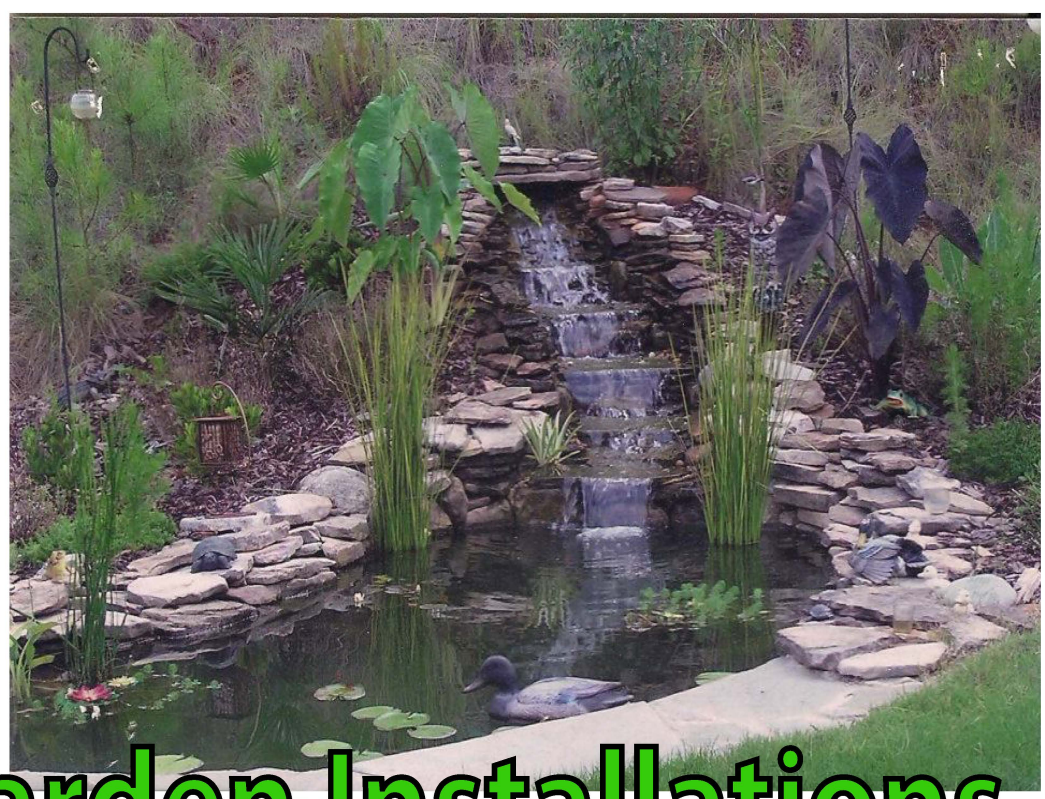
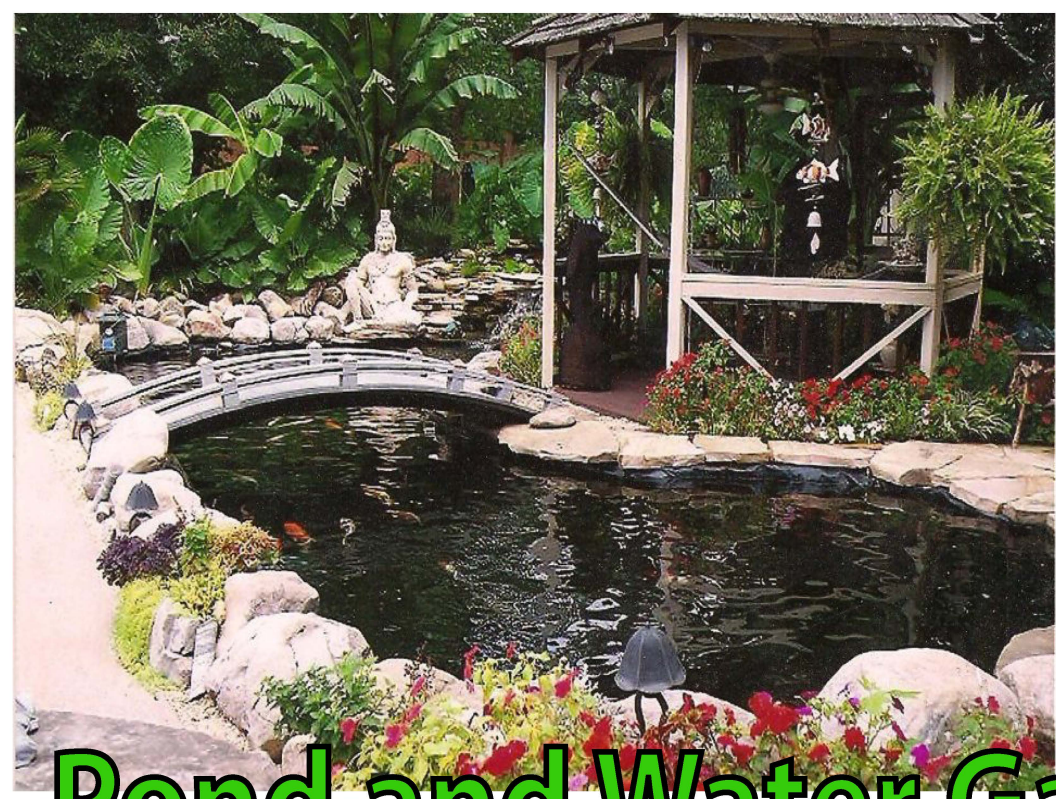
1. The North Carolina Arboretum—Asheville, NC

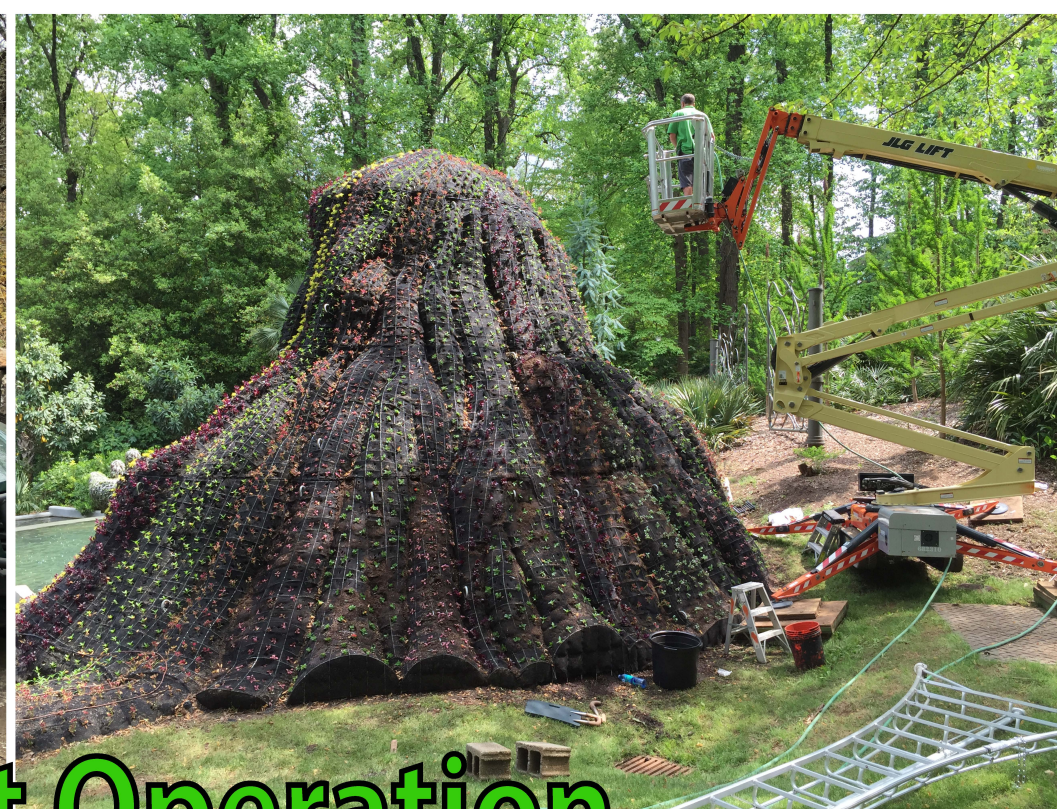
